## CHURCH CONFERENCE

In January and June of every year the pastor will hold a semi-annual church conference inviting the entire membership of the Greater Springfield Community Church. We meet and discuss the work of the church. Here, each leader has an opportunity to read their reports where each member gets an idea of what has been accomplished and what is going on in the church as a whole.

### WHAT IT MEANS TO BE A CHRISTIAN

Becoming a Christian is a growth process that goes on one's entire life span. Once a person has decided to become a Christian, he or she enters a journey that should mold them to think, feel and act more like Jesus. One becomes a Christian as they press their way in becoming more Christ like as they develop patterns of trust in God.

The first big step then, in becoming a Christian is to accept Jesus Christ as Lord and savior of your life, and to accept his plan as your blueprint by which you will live and serve. Christian living comes as the Christian grows and develops themselves to a systematic program of study, training and work. Becoming a Christian doesn't happen overnight, it is a growth process which is a lifelong commitment.

To be a Christian means to be identified with Jesus. This means that you must keep striving to bring your thinking and actions in conformity with the life and spirit and mind of Christ.

- Christians are Continuously Tempted. You must not think you will not be tempted since you become a Christian. Temptations will be increased and will be moresevere. You have just enlisted in the Lord's army and will now need the Lord's armor. (Read Ephesians 6:11-18).
- Christians Have Greater Joy. No joy is taken from the person who becomes a Christian. In fact, to become a Christian place one in a position to have real joy, the happiest possible life. Jesus said to believers, "These things have I spoken unto you, that my joy might remain in you, and that your joy might be full" (John 15:11).
- Christians Have Larger Liberty. It does not take away one's liberty to become a Christian. In fact, the Christian has larger liberty. He is no longer a slave to needless restrictions and endless prohibitions. We read, Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty (2 Cor. 3:17). The Christian is delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God (Rom. 8:21). The Christian has God's freedom, which means he can do anything but commit sin, and this He will not desire to do.
- There are some Definite Do's as a Christian. Keep yourselves in the love of God (Jude 21). There are some definite do's you will need to make as a Christian to follow certain lines of activities which will aid greatly in the Christian life:
  - Love the Church. "Christ also loved the church and gave himself for it" (Eph. 5:25). The
    fact that Christ loved the church is sufficient reason for us to love it and support it and give
    ourselves for it. Christ gave himself for the church daily during his earthly life by teaching,
    preaching and healing.
  - **Worship the Lord.** Worship and fellowship with God should be both private and public. Both are essential and fill different needs in life.
  - **Study the Word.** "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not be ashamed" (2 Timothy 2:15).
  - **Serve the Lord.** Jesus said. "I am among you as he that serveth" (Luke 22:21). You must labor for the Lord or lose the influence of Christian life.
  - **Keep His Commandments.** Obedience is taught in all of the Bible and is absolutely necessary for success in the Christian life.
  - **Give Your Money.** "God loveth a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7). "Honor the Lord with thy substance, and with the first fruits of all the increase" (Proverbs 3:9).
  - Live for Others. "Love one another" (John 15:17).
  - **Be of Good Cheer.** Jesus says to be of good cheer because He has overcome the world (John 16:33).
  - **Keep Moving Forward.** "I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus" (Phil 3:14).

## THE COMMISSION AT GREATER SPRINGFIELD COMMUNITY CHURCH

The Greater Springfield Community Church is committed to the Great Commission mentioned in Matthew 28: 19-20 where the Lord said "Go and *make disciples* of all nations, *baptizing them* in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and *teaching them* to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age." If the church fails to do these things it has forsaken its divine commission. To effectively carry out this divine commission Greater Springfield Community Church has organized itself around the following major concerns represented by the following commissions:

- 1. The Commission of Membership and Evangelism. Whose major function is to lead the church as a whole in getting people to fall in love with Christ and the Church, and be serviceable to both. Bringing new recruits into the Fellowship is its major task. Reclaiming backsliders and stirring up the careless and unconcerned members are also numbered among its task.
- 2. The Commission on Christian Education. The work of this commission is that of helping to qualify every member so as to lead and guide each into coming active first-class Christians, and active first-class citizens. Christian education reinforces everything the church does in that it seeks to inform the members concerning their obligations to God, and helps them to understand what this means. This commission is responsible for seeing that each member has many opportunities for being taught, and for the systematic growth and development of his Christian character.

Christian education means that The Greater Springfield Community Church is an educational institution, interested in deepening the faith and understanding of every member. This it does through our worship services, study groups, discipleship classes, meetings, bible study and in other ways where empowerment, faith and hope is being taught.

1. The Commission on Christian Social Relations. The Greater Springfield Community Church has always recognized that Christians cannot be effective servants of God unless they become a part of the community and world in which they live. We cannot isolate ourselves within the four walls of our church building and ignore what is happening in the local community or the world community and still be Christians.

Christians should be working to bring in the kingdom of God, the beloved community. This commission is responsible for keeping the congregation mindful of these things. It should lead the members to participate in whatever is designed to make the community a better place for every citizen.

This commission should lead the congregation in being concerned about temperance, health, education, world peace, race relations, political and economic affairs and every issue which is related to the creation and maintenance of a good social order.

- 1. *The Commission of Public Relations*. This commission is responsible for gathering and circulating information about our church which will be of public interest. Its function is to keep the church in the media with information about its programs, projects and personalities.
- 2. The Commission on Stewardship and Finance. This commission is directly under the supervision of the Official Board and gets its orders and directions from the Board. After the Official Board approves and adopts the budget for the year, the Commission on Stewardship and Finance organizes every member canvass through which every member is urged to pledge to the budget accordingly to his ability. Scripture encourages Christian giving. Leviticus 27:30 (TLB) says, "A tenth of the produce of the land, whether grain or fruit, is the Lord's, and is holy." And Proverbs 3:9 (NIV) says, "Honor the Lord with your wealth, with the first fruits of all your crops."

This commission is responsible for making suggestions which will insure the church that every phase of its program for the year will be adequately under-girded financially. The commission reports monthly to the Official Board and is kept accurately informed by the board concerning every detail of the financial condition of the church.

### **ABOUT SALVATION**

We believe that salvation is a gift from God to man. Therefore, God freely offers salvation to those who place their faith on the death and resurrection of Christ as sufficient payment for their sin.

## **ABOUT HUMANITY**

We believe that all people were created in the image of God to have a right relationship with Him but became alienated and separated from God in that relationship through sinful disobedience. As a result, people are incapable of regaining a right relationship with God through their own efforts. We are only saved by grace.

## **ABOUT THE SACRAMENTS**

A traditional definition for sacrament is that it is "an outward and visible symbol of an inward and spiritual grace."

In the Christian tradition only two sacraments are considered to be ordained by Christ in the Gospels (Matthew 3:13-17; 26:26-28). To be a sacrament a rite must have been established by Jesus and participated in by Jesus himself. It must also be a means of strengthening a relationship with God and a commitment to continue the redemptive ministry of Jesus.

#### **ABOUT BAPTISM**

We believe baptism symbolizes the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus and is the public declaration that you have accepted Jesus Christ as your personal Savior. Baptism is a symbolic, but powerful demonstration to the world that you are a Christ-follower. While baptism is not required for salvation, it is a biblical command and demonstrates your love and obedience to Christ.

### **ABOUT COMMUNION**

We believe Communion, or the Lord's Supper, is an ordinance given to all Christ-followers by Jesus Christ to remember his sacrifice for us and to symbolize the new covenant. The elements of bread and wine or juice are symbols of Christ's broken body and shed blood. Communion is not a means of salvation. Rather, it is a statement of a Christ-follower's faith in the atoning work of the cross.

## **Christian Terminology**

1. **Atonement:** The reconciliation of humanity with God through the sacrificial death of Jesus Christ, providing forgiveness of sins.

Scripture: "In him, we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace." (Ephesians 1:7)

2. **Believe:** To accept, trust, and have faith in the teachings, promises, and person of Jesus Christ for salvation.

Scripture: "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16)

3. **Confess:** Acknowledge and admit one's sins to God, seeking forgiveness and cleansing through Christ.

Scripture: "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:9)

4. **Condemnation:** The state of being judged guilty and deserving of punishment, which is replaced by believers' justification through faith in Christ.

Scripture: "Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus." (Romans 8:1)

5. **Edification:** The process of spiritual and moral growth, building up individuals and the Christian community through teaching and encouragement.

Scripture: "But the one who prophesies speaks to people for their strengthening, encouraging, and comfort." (1 Corinthians 14:3)

6. **Forgiveness:** The act of pardoning sins and offenses, granted by God through Christ's sacrifice, and extended to believers as they forgive others.

Scripture: "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you." (Colossians 3:13)

7. **Glorification:** The final stage of salvation when believers are transformed into the likeness of Christ and enjoy eternal fellowship with God.

Scripture: "And those he predestined, he also called; those he called, he also justified; those he justified, he also glorified." (Romans 8:30)

8. **Grace:** God's unmerited favor and love, freely given to humanity, especially in salvation through faith in Jesus Christ.

Scripture: "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God." (Ephesians 2:8)

- 9. **Holy:** Set apart and morally pure; God's holiness is absolute, and believers are called to live holy lives through the power of the Holy Spirit.
  - Scripture: "But just as he who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do." (1 Peter 1:15)
- 10. **Intercede:** To mediate or intervene on behalf of others, often in prayer, as Jesus intercedes for believers before God.
  - Scripture: "Christ Jesus, who died—more than that, who was raised to life—is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us." (Romans 8:34)
- 11. **Justification:** The act of God declaring a sinner righteous through faith in Jesus Christ, based on His atoning work.
  - Scripture: "Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." (Romans 5:1)
- 12. **Mercy:** Compassionate and undeserved kindness or forgiveness, particularly shown by God toward sinners. Scripture: "The Lord is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and rich in love." (Psalm 145:8)
- 13. **Predestined:** God's foreordaining or choosing of individuals for salvation before the foundation of the world. Scripture: "For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight." (Ephesians 1:4)
- 14. **Reconciled:** The restoration of a relationship between God and humanity through Christ's sacrifice, overcoming the separation caused by sin.
  - Scripture: "All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation." (2 Corinthians 5:18)
- 15. **Redemption:** The act of buying back or freeing someone from bondage; in Christianity, it refers to Christ's payment for humanity's sins.
  - Scripture: "In him, we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace." (Ephesians 1:7)
- 16. **Repentance:** Genuine remorse for one's sins, accompanied by a turning away from sin and a turning towards God.
  - Scripture: "Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord." (Acts 3:19)

17. **Resurrection:** The rising to life again, particularly Jesus Christ's triumph over death, offering believers the hope of eternal life.

Scripture: "Jesus said to her, 'I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die." (John 11:25)

18. **Righteous:** Morally upright and in conformity with God's standards; believers are declared righteous through faith in Christ.

Scripture: "This righteousness is given through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe." (Romans 3:22)

19. **Sacrifice**: A voluntary offering made to God, often involving the giving up of something valuable; Jesus' death on the cross is the ultimate sacrifice for sin.

Scripture: "Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God." (Ephesians 5:2)

20. **Salvation:** The deliverance from sin and its consequences through faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

Scripture: "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 6:23)

21. **Sanctification:** The ongoing process of being set apart for God's purposes and transformed into Christ's likeness.

Scripture: "But we ought always to thank God for you, brothers and sisters loved by the Lord because God chose you as firstfruits to be saved through the sanctifying work of the Spirit and through belief in the truth." (2 Thessalonians 2:13)

22. **Transgression (Sin):** Violation of God's law or will, leading to separation from God; forgiveness is found through repentance and faith in Christ.

Scripture: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23)

23. **Trespass:** Wrongful actions or offenses committed against God or others; forgiveness is sought through confession and repentance.

Scripture: "And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us." (Matthew 6:12)

24. **Triune God:** The understanding of God as three persons in one essence—Father, Son (Jesus Christ), and Holy Spirit—each fully and equally God, existing in perfect unity.

Scripture: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Matthew 28:19)
